
Eliezer Finds a Wife for Isaac

He turned to his trusted servant, Eliezer.


"Eliezer, I have the most important task for you:

(Genesis 24:12-14)






A woman named Rebecca then came to the well to fill up her jug.

"Would your camels like a drink of water too?" she asked.




